



Second Wave of Believers



* A brief gap in the revelations

- It is reported that there was a gap for a few weeks.
- The Prophet got a bit depressed and concerned.
- Allah reveals verses reassuring him that He has not abandoned him.

Early believers (Sabiqoon al Awwaloon)

- Some of the first people who believed started preaching within their close contacts.
- Particularly Abu Bakr's dawah brought many prominent people to Islam. Some of them were:
 - Uthman bin 'Affan; Az-Zubair bin 'Awwam; Abdur Rahman bin 'Awf; Sa'd bin Abi Waqqas; Talhah bin 'Ubaidulla.
- Early believers were from among different groups, rich, poor, with good status, slaves etc.





Wudu and Prayers




❖Wudu


• Jibril (AS) taught the Prophet # how to make wudu.


Early form of prayers

- 2 Rakah in the morning and 2 Rakah in the night.
- Believers used to pray secretly in their houses and mountains.
- According to some narrations, these were obligatory prayers at that time.














Ayath Revealed Per Year





Note: These numbers are approximate and could vary according to different scholars








Words Revealed Per Year


- Surahs revealed in the Second Year of Nabawi
 - Ad-Dhuha (93)
 - As-Sharh /Al-Inshirah (94)
 - At-Takweer (81)
 - Al-Infitar (82)





93. Surah Ad-Duhaa (The Morning Light)





- This Surah was revealed after a brief gap.
- Allah reassures the Prophet (and believers) that He has not abandoned him (them).
- The Prophet and early believers are reminded of the signs of Allah
 - The morning light
 - Evening and darkness
- The Prophet is commanded to support social issues (i.e. take care of poor and orphans).










94. Surah As-Sharh (Uplifting the Heart)





- This Surah revealed together with the previous one.
- Reminds us about the great status of the Prophet...
- Reassurance given that ease follows hardships.
- During ease or hardship, establish connection with Allah.










81. Surah At-Takweer (Putting out 'the Sun')





- The early believers were told about the fears of the day of judgement.
- They are reassured that it is not Shaitan but a sacred angel (Jibril AS) who is bringing these verses.
- The Quran is guidance for the entire humanity.










82. Surah Al-Infitar (The 'Sky' Splitting Open)





- More emphasis on the day of judgement.
- Early believers are told how humans have been created.
- Humans ignore the truth because they don't care about the day of judgement.
- Two types of people: Abraar and Fujjar.
- The success of the hereafter depends on purely on one's actions.










Seerah-Quran Connection



- ❖ In the early days, there is a heavy emphasis on getting attention of the people on:
 - Signs in the heavens and earth;
 - Reality of the colossal earthly and heavenly bodies (they will be decimated eventually);
 - Happening on the day of judgement;
- *Advised to connect with Allah.
- Encouraged to be optimistic, grateful, give charity and connect and contribute with the society.

















Takeaway 1: Be Positive and Patient



وعن أبي يحيى صهيب بن سنان رضي الله عنه قال: قال رسول الله صلى الله عليه وسلم "عجبا لأمر المؤمن إن أمره كله له خير، وليس ذلك لأحد إلا للمؤمن: إن أصابته سراء شكر فكان خيراً له، وإن أصابته ضراء صبر فكان خيراً .)(رواه مسلم)له" (

Abu Yahya Suhaib bin Sinan (May Allah be pleased with him) reported that: The Messenger of Allah(ﷺ) said, "How wonderful is the case of a believer; **there is good for him in everything** and this applies only to a believer. If prosperity attends him, **he expresses gratitude** to Allah and that is good for him; and if adversity befalls him, **he endures it patiently** and that is better for him". [Muslim].

Anas bin Mallik [may Allah be pleased with him] narrates, saying: "I used to often hear the Prophet(*) supplicating with these words: 'O Allah, I seek refuge in You from sadness, grief, helplessness, laziness, being stingy, overwhelming debt, and the overpowering of men'




