Recap of Makkah Events



- ❖ The Prophet ≝ secludes to the cave Hira at the age of 40 years.
- ❖ First five verses of the Surah Alaq are revealed.
- ❖ After a brief gap the second revelation happens, and commandment is given to start dawah.
- Close relatives and friends accepts his message and subsequently other close friends follows.
- ❖ The early believers used to meet at Dar Al-Arqam.





Time for open invitation

- For three years the Prophet ## trained his close associates and formed a team of true believers,
- It was time to give open invitation so Allah revealed the verse to extend Dawah to the relatives

❖ First dinner invitation to the relatives

- The Prophet invited people from his tribe (Banu Hashim) to a dinner to give them dawah to Islam
- His uncle Abu Lahab did not allow the Prophet stalk

وَأَنذِرُ عَشِيرَتَكَ الْأَقْرَبِينَ - 26:214 And warn, [O Muhammad], your closest kindred.







Second dinner invitation to the relatives

- The Prophet invited his tribe again and told them that he is the messenger
- Although Abu Talib did not accept the message, he promised to support the Prophet **
- Abu Lahab again mocked the Prophet ## and rejected the call
- Ali (RA), who was just 14 year old, stood up and announced his faith and his support to the Prophet ******







Call from Mount Safa

- To give a message to all of Makkah, the Prophet ascended mount As-Safa and started calling.
- He used the words "O Sabahah" to gather people. It is an Arabic expression to draw attention to a grave danger.
- He called each tribe by name.
- He called them to
 - Testify to the Oneness of Allah
 - Believe in his Prophethood
 - Believe in the Day of Resurrection
- Abu Lahab cursed the Prophet # after hearing this
- Surah Al-Masad was revealed subsequently. Allah cursed Abu Lahab and his wife









*****Reaction of Quraish

- They mocked the Prophet by calling him a poet, madman, soothsayer, liar etc.
- They ridiculed and made fun of the early believers particularly the poor ones.
- They reached out to Abu Talib to ask him to stop the Prophet.
- Abu Talib continued to support the Prophet.














Ayath Revealed Per Year





Note: These numbers are approximate and could vary according to different scholars








Words Revealed Per Year

102. At-Takathur	Avoid chasing the worldly things; prepare for the grave and hereafter


Seerah-Quran Connection




- ❖ After the open invitation, the Surahs that were revealed covered the following:
 - Definition of Tawheed; Emphasis on Might of Allah; Sign in the humans and the universe
 - Detailed and repeated discussions on the day of judgement, punishment of Hell, rewards of the Paradise
 - Humans have been given freedom choice; it is emphasized to choose the right path and succeed
 - Think about the next stage of life i.e. life after death; Remember that good deeds and bad deeds are recorded
 - Avoid chasing worldly things, prepare for grave and the next life
 - Avoid bad characters such as being immoral, stingy and backbiter
 - Follow the Prophet and have the reward of drinking from Kawthar
 - Seek protection from all evils

















Takeaway 1: Beware of the fitnah of wealth

Takeaway 2: Don't be pretentiousness and do not exaggerate during conversations



وعن جابر بن عبد الله رضي الله عنهما أن رسول الله صلى الله عليه وسلم قال: "إن من أحبكم إلي، وأقربكم مني مجلسًا يوم القيامة، أحاسنكم أخلاقًا، وإن أبغضكم إلي وأبعدكم مني يوم القيامة، والثرثارون، وقد سبق شرحه في باب حسن الخلق.)(رواه الترمذي وقال حديث حسن)(. والمتشدقون، والمتفيهقون"

Jabir bin 'Abdullah (May Allah be pleased with them) said: The Messenger of Allah (*) said, "The dearest and the closest of you to me on the Day of Resurrection will be those who are the **best in behaviour**; and the most hateful and the farthest from me on the Day of Resurrection will be the **talkative and the most pretentious and the most rhetorical**." [At-Tirmidhi].

وعن زياد بن علاقة عن عمه، وهو قطبة بن مالك، رضي الله عنه، قال: كان النبي صلى الله عليه . رواه الترمذي وقال وسلم، يقول: "اللهم إني أعوذ بك من منكرات الأخلاق، والأعمال، والأهواء" حسن.

Ziyad bin 'Ilaqah reported: My uncle Qutbah bin Malik (May Allah be pleased with him) said that the Prophet (*) used to supplicate: "Allahumma inni a'udhu bika min munkaratil-akhlaqi, wal-a'mali, wal- ahwa'i (O Allah! I seek refuge in You from undesirable manners, deeds, and aspirations)."




